


Can't wait to see what shows up. Depending on the weather and Covid, we may choose to meet outside. Plants can be placed on tables in the pavilion.

TRAINING DIRECTOR'S REPORT



FALL CLASSES: We will begin our fall schedule of classes on Labor Day. Classes will be posted on the web no later than 1 August and may be there sooner. As you may remember we are incentivizing early enrollment by providing a \$20 discount and hoping this works to get folks to sign up in a timely manner.

AGILITY: Unfortunately, our plans to have Gill teach agility classes for us on Tuesday morning is not going to happen. Our Agility Committee (Dianne Strickland, Ann Ouchterloney and Terri Reel) are discussing the possibility of offering a 6-week *Introduction to Agility* class that would provide the student with an idea of the kind of skills needed by both handler and dog to continue on to pursue a title. If any of you would be interested in helping formulate the structure for this class, please email me. The more of us working on this, the better!

ENROLLMENT: The Board has voted to participate in a senior seminar for students in School of Computing at UNF. A small group of students will work with us to create a web-based enrollment system. On to practice for Excellent!




RECENT TRIAL UPDATES



Ban on Dogs From ‘High-Risk’ Countries a Wake-up Call About Importation Health Crisis

In a major wake-up call about the dangers of importing foreign dogs from certain regions, the U.S. will begin in mid-July banning the importation of dogs from more than 100 nations that are at high risk for rabies and other highly contagious diseases, many of which can jump species and infect humans.

The CDC estimates that of the approximately 1 million dogs imported annually into the U.S., about 110,000 originate from countries with “high risk” for rabies and other diseases. [High-risk regions include](#) many countries in the Middle East, Africa, South America, Eastern Europe, and Asia, including China.

Most recently, a dog imported with rabies from Azerbaijan by a U.S. rescue was placed with a family in Pennsylvania. The dog was one of 34 animals — 33 dogs and one cat — imported into O’Hare International Airport in Chicago on June 10. The rabid dog also exposed 12 people to the disease, sparking a multi-state investigation to determine the potential spread and [costing taxpayers](#) as much as a half-million dollars.

The CDC’s ban is warranted as a temporary fix given how dangerous the situation has become. But for the longer term, policymakers should take two tacks.



