

The FDA claims conditions at the firm's facilities likely contributed to the illness or death of hundreds of dogs and cats. The dog food is sold under the following brand names: CanineX, Earthborn Holistic, Meridian, Nunn Better, Pro Pac, Pro Pac Ultimates, Splash, Sportmix, Sportmix, Wholesomes, Sportstrail, Unrefined and Venture.

My wife Loretta and I moved to The Villages Florida from Northern Virginia, after I retired about 10 years ago. Last year, we moved to St. Johns to be nearer to our Grandkids who are 5 and 7 years old.

When my son was about 7 or 8 years old we were thinking about getting a dog, but I was not sure it was a good idea. One day, we were at my son's Little League practice and his coach's wife walked up with this big yellow dog. I asked her what it was and she said it was a yellow Lab. I was pretty sure she was lying to me since I knew Labs only came in black. She also told me she was raising it to be a guide dog for Guiding Eyes for the Blind and that she would keep it for a year and then return it to the school for training. This seemed like a good deal to me because I was not sure I wanted the long term commitment of owning a dog. To make a long story short, we raised four yellow Labs, none of which became guides, but two of which were used as breeders (supposedly top 5% of dogs). We also adopted two of the labs. Since our house was filling up with dogs, we suspended our puppy raising until we got down to Florida. We immediately began raising puppies for Southeastern Guide Dogs. Our first puppy was an almost white Golden Retriever. I discovered Goldens are different from Labs. He went on to become a guide and is still working. After that we raised a yellow Lab that went on to become a guide, and then a yellow Lab that became a service dog for a veteran with PTSD.


The next dog we raised was Magic. His Magic level exceeded that allowed in a guide dog, so we adopted him when he was released from the school. He did very well the first 6 weeks, until they took him outside for training. Magic had issues with anything that moved, leaves were the worst, but he also liked bunnies, squirrels and armadillos. Even though I had raised him from a puppy I still could not walk him around the block without being dragged to everything that was interesting. So I decided to enter him in an interim obedience class at Marion Alachua dog training. At this point I had had no formal training in dog obedience other than basic commands we were taught by the guide dog schools. What I did not realize was that the class I had signed him up for was obedience for dog trials. During this class, I learned two things. First, all types of dogs are smart, and second that obedience was not for me. But one of the instructors suggested Rally to me because Magic takes additional guidance which you can give in Rally.

So over the next 3 years, Magic and I practiced and went to Rally trials. Initially, all I wanted to do was qualify. In Magic's first off lead Advanced trial (which was outside), he decided to run out of the ring and say high to someone eating nachos in their truck that was parked right outside the ring. I had seen this happen to other people, and I was told if you could call them back, you still might qualify. After he realized the guy would not give him any nachos, he looked over at me and I called him back into the ring. He came back to heel and we finished up and I got a qualifying score. I was very happy. Since that time, we got better, and this year he got his Championship Title in

Rally. We also somehow managed to get his CD and had fun getting his Trick Dog Intermediate title. Since we finished up Rally, Magic and I are now working on Agility and Open obedience.

We also raised another guide puppy since Magic. His name is JC, and while we were raising him he got his Novice Rally title in ASCA. But when he was a little over a year old he developed some fear issues related to scents. Since this was during Covid and the school was not able to take as many dogs back for training, they released him without taking him in for formal evaluation. We adopted him. I have started working him in AKC Rally and plan to show him soon.

We are trying to figure out when we will get our next guide dog puppy, but right now, I am happy working on Magic and JC and playing with our grandkids
