



K-9 Mentoring Program UPDATE

So far, the K-9 mentoring program been open to a very few members to see how it worked at K-9. A seasoned trainer has been working with a few members in an informal setting when convenient for all involved. The main focus of the mentoring is to find out what the handler could benefit from. This can take many forms and is a friendly conversation were talking about their dogs lets the mentor and handler get to know each other as well as the dog. Sometimes it might include listening to a problem and helping to solve it with suggestions and trying some out with the dog. Other times it might be a training issue for a particular sport and helping to demonstrate an exercise. But it always revolves around what the handler considers important.

Setting up a mentoring partnership is easy and can take as little as an hour a week. It can include meeting up at K-9 or even a phone call. If you are a seasoned trainer with someone in mind that doesn't currently have a class appropriate for them, or know of someone that wants to get started in the sport that you enjoy, reach out to them and ask if they would like to be a part of the mentoring at K-9. If you would like to be a mentor and don't have a person in mind, let **Alison Nelson** know and an effort will be made to find someone for you to mentor.


K-9 held another Show N Go in April 24. There was lots of fun and interest. We have another one planned for May 22, hope to see you there to participate or volunteer.

General Meeting Guest Speaker – Dr. Abbott

For those of you who weren't able to attend the meeting on April 21 you missed a great opportunity to hear Dr. Abbott. It was like having a private consultation and well worth the time. While Dr. Abbott didn't give a formal presentation but geared his talk to answering questions, most on the minds of inquiring dog owners, ranging from diet to dermatology conditions.



Dr. Abbott told us how allergies and fleas are now a year-round problem in North Florida and the most effective way to treat these conditions is avoidance. He recommends using unscented baby wipes and frequent baths for dogs that are susceptible to allergies. To identify allergens, he prefers intradermal skin tests rather than blood tests, which are less effective.

Dr. Abbott also recommends fatty acids in the dog's diets. Omega 3 is his preference based on the total amount of fatty acid, EPA and DHA, in supplements (e.g., Snip-it, Derma-3 and Welactin). Watch out for supplements as some may contain mercury. Flax seed isn't a good source of omega 3 in dogs and omega 6 (found in coconut oil) should never be orally given to dogs.

Food allergies are over diagnosed and because of the quality control and the multitude of studies done he recommends certain dog foods, including but not limited to Purina and Pedigree foods. Dogs should not be fed a grain free diet and for dog owners who want to prepare homemade foods, there are websites, designed by veterinarians; he suggests checking out the balanceit.com and petdiets.com. While Purina foods are good, their treats are not. He recommends reading food labels including where the products are soured and manufactured.

As with everything moderation is the key, no more than 10% of the diet should be treats and snacks. Many dogs are lactose intolerant but for those that can tolerate dairy, yogurt is OK but keep the sugar to a minimum.

Allergies worsen with age. While there are no cures it's just something you need to learn to live with. Benadryl is useless in dogs as it doesn't concentrate in the skin, however topical Benadryl does work. Zyrtec and Claritin can help but never give a dog a decongestant. Designer vaccinations work but can be costly and most vets don't have the expertise to create them.

Dr. Abbott encourages everyone to brush our dog's teeth brushed. He sees a lot of dental issues; CET toothpaste is his preferred brand.

Dog Overheating Symptoms

Understanding the early warning signs and symptoms of overheating in dogs can make all the difference between losing and saving the life of your dog. In no time at all, an overheated dog can hamper brain, heart, nervous system or liver function. Overheated dog symptoms include:

- Excessive, heavy panting
- Drooling
- Increased heart pulse
- Dry, pale gums
- Glassy looking eyes

- Disorientation: Severe dog overheating can also manifest in confusion.
- Weakness; the dog may even collapse.
- Vomiting
- Rectal bleeding
- Diarrhea
- Bright red tongue
- Staggering
- If your dog falls on its side take it is an emergency. Cool it down as explained below and then take it to the vet.
- Seizures

What to Do When Your Dog Is Overheated

Here are some guidelines on how to cool down a dog that is overheating or overheated.

- 1. **Get your dog out of the heat:** The first step in treating overheating in dogs is of course to stop further temperature rises. Running a fan can also help.
- 2. **Give your dog cool, fresh water immediately:** Drinking water helps with dog overheating recovery.
- 3. **Use cool water to lower your dog's temperature:** Pour or sprinkle cool water on your dog's belly and groin area, or place it a bathtub full of water; NEVER use ice or cold water for the purpose, as it can constrict the blood vessels in the skin and make the condition worse. Placing towels soaked in cool water on the back, neck, under the forelimbs, and in the groin, area can also help to stop dog overheating.
- 4. **Massage your pooch's legs:** leg massage helps to boost blood circulation and thus put the dog at lower risk of shock.
- 5. When to take your dog to the vet: After using the home remedies mentioned above to control dog overheating, you may still want to take your dog to the vet. The dog may be dehydrated or have other complications that warrant treatment.
