If you wish to have your discount for classes in 2023? See page 8 for details on your volunteer hours requirement to maintain the discount.


Rachel Flatley will return to K-9 on December 4 for an obedience seminar.


General Meeting Guest Speaker

Thanksgiving Food for Dogs: Have a Pet-Safe Feast!

Keep Your Dog's Belly Calm This Thanksgiving

As you set your holiday table, don't forget to make a safe setting for your pet to keep your family's feast happy and stress-free!

Follow these quick tips to keep your pup included in the day's festivities while avoiding any turkey day mishaps.

Opt for pet-safe chew bones! If you want to make it feel extra special, wait to give your dog their chew bone until everyone sits down at the table for dinner.

Avoid Mid-Meal Begging: If your dog loves begging for scraps during mealtime on a normal day, Thanksgiving will have them pulling out all the stops, including the puppy eyes! (Can't say we blame them with all those drool-worthy smells in the air.) Keep them happy and away from the dinner table with puzzle toys that can be stuffed with yummy treats, or try adding a freeze-dried topper to their regular food.

Is Turkey on Your Dog's Menu?: <u>If you do decide to slice up some turkey or plate up some</u> other favorites for your pup, keep these guidelines in mind:

- Serve them turkey without the skin, as it can have fats and seasonings that we find delicious but can easily upset your dog's stomach.
- Feed them only small amounts of turkey, and make sure that it is fully cooked.
- Say no to stuffing due to ingredients like onions and garlic that are harmful to dogs.
- Your pup should pass on the green bean casserole, but you can save some plain, fiber-filled green beans for their dish.
- Skip the pie, but you can safely opt for plain, canned pumpkin (just not pumpkin pie filling).
 On the (Dinner Table) be defensive: If you and your guests are distracted by parades, football or playful pups and kittens on the TV, make sure leftovers, especially turkey bones, are out of reach of your dog. A curious pup surfing counters or table can quickly lead to a tummy ache not to mention sad guests who were hoping for seconds if leftovers aren't stashed away!

We hope you and your dog have a happy Thanksgiving! If you have any questions about your pet's diet or health, we recommend reaching out to your veterinarian.







Always double check that PAVILION FANS and LIGHTS are turned off when you leave--THIS INCLUDES THE BATHROOMS. K-9 has strategically located automatic LED security lights to light your walk to the car. When leaving, always check that you have locked the gate to the grounds. Remember that ALL visitors to K-9 for any reason--meetings, seminars, classes, training--are required to wear close toe shoes for their safety and K-9's liability. No flip flops!!!

Keep the feet on the agility fences side by side-do not overlap. When the gates blow over, if they are overlapped, the gates tangle and breakage occurs. Likewise, keep the agility gates 6 feet from the Pavilion floor. Again, when they blow over, if they are too close to the pavilion, they crash into the flexible ring gating and breakage results.

Members are welcome to leave a crate for their dog at K-9. Please keep the crate clean and labeled with your name. K-9 belongs to the members, and it is hoped that every member will treat this fabulous facility like their own. All routine clean-up is done by member volunteers, so pitch in! One person alone cannot keep K-9 in tiptop shape; it's too big. But with every member's support, we can keep the place shaped up. You can help by picking up litter if you see it, sweeping up a pile of leaves if they are accumulated, straightening up and stacking scattered chairs if they are left in the aisles.

This is your club, it is hoped you will help take care of it. - Alison Nelson




