


***K-9 Tails* needs a new editor!**




**AN EXAMPLE OF A

CPE**

CPE is a popular agility venue (also for k9 Scent Sport). Canine Performance Events are open to all breeds and breed mixes and the organization does not require spaying and neutering for mixed breeds. There are six titling levels, including an entry level that doesn't use the teeter or the weave poles (which can be challenging for novices). There are several divisions that allow dogs to jump a variety of heights. CPE offers Standard classes and a variety of games classes. See <http://www.k9cpe.com/> for further info.

FROM THE BOARD

The Board has been engaged in discussions about a number of things and have realized a couple of things.

First and foremost: We have not communicated with the membership regarding important ideas and policies. So beginning with this newsletter, we will include items of interest to the general membership from each Board meeting. **Policy changes will be posted here for member review and comments.**

Second: CLUB POLICIES

We realized that over the years various Boards have made policies for the club which were duly preserved in the minutes, but which, over the intervening years, have been totally forgotten, partially forgotten, perhaps incorrectly remembered . . .

Thus, we found ourselves in the position of believing the club had policies on certain issues, but we weren't sure exactly what those policies were and where we might find them. So we began a project to read through the Board and General Membership minutes of the last 20 years to try to locate those policies and to put them in a new document organized in a manner so that they can readily be found. In the future all policy changes will automatically be added to this document.

From Dennis Sprung, President of AKC: “

... There has been an increase in the demand for purebred dogs and we have heard countless stories of responsible breeders that are doing their very best to find the right homes for their dogs. The result has been a steady and solid increase in AKC registrations over the past year. As of this month, AKC dog registrations are up 20% over this time last year and litter registrations are up 18%. We have also seen increased traffic on AKC Marketplace with inquiries to breeders up 61% compared to last year.”

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR K-9 OBEDIENCE CLUB?

This means more puppies and we are getting requests from more people than we can serve. We need help! AGILITY AT K-9

The Agility Committee (Dianne Strickland., Ann Ouchterloney and Terri Reel) has been working to bring a quality beginner agility program to K9 and it will be happening in late summer, early fall. The Board has approved this. Our instructor will be Gil Chapman, who is an AKC judge and has earned multiple MACH titles. Class will run 6 weeks with \$150 fee and will meet on Tuesday mornings. We hoped to begin in June, but circumstances in the instructor's life have made this impossible.
