Recommendations for private training

Certified Professional Dog Trainers (CPDT) that are "knowledge assessed" have been through extensive training in dog behavior, and have a thorough understanding of how dogs learn. They also must have hands-on training experience. A CPDT would generally be a good starting point for private lessons to help modify your dog's behavior.
